EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA)

(La Ley-cada estudiante tenga exito ESSA por sus siglas en ingles)

- Federal legislation passed to allow for the use of methods and instructional strategies to strengthen the academic program in the school, increase the amount and quality of learning, and help provide an enriched and accelerated curriculum, which may include programs, activities, and courses necessary to provide a well-rounded education.

WHAT IS TITLE I? (¿QUÉ ES TÍTULO I?)

- Title I is a federally funded academic assistance program for schools.
(Titulo I - es un programa de fondos Federales para la asistencia académica de las escuelas.)
- The goal of Title I is to ensure a high quality well-rounded education for every child. *(La meta de Titulo I - es asegurar una alta educación de alta calidad para cada uno de los niños/as.)*

Ensures schools measure student progress using approved tests.

Provides teacher training and professional development to improve instruction.

Sets high expectations for academic achievement.

(Fija expectativas altas para el logro académico.)

Requires yearly testing for Grades 3-8 and High School.

(Requiere exámenes anualmente para los Grados 3ro al 8to y la preparatoria.)

*FOR STUDENTS, ESSA:

Provides teachers who are licensed by the state of Nevada and use proven teaching methods.

(Provee maestros con licencia por el estado de Nevada los cuales utilizan métodos de enseñanza aprobados.)

Parents' Rights and Responsibilities

- The right to receive periodic progress reports on the child and the school. *(El derecho de recibir informes de progreso académico del niño/a y de la escuela periódicamente.)*
- The right to request information about the qualifications of their child's teacher. *(El derecho de solicitar información acerca de las credenciales del maestro de su hijo/a.)*

- The right to help decide if the school's Title I program is meeting the needs of their child.

(El derecho de ayudar a decidir si el programa de Título I dentro de la escuela esta llenando las necesidades de su hijo/a.)

- The right to offer suggestions for academic improvement and increased parental involvement.

(El derecho de ofrecer sugerencias para un mejoramiento académico y aumentar la participación de los padres.)

- The responsibility to share information with the teacher about their child's interests and abilities.

(La responsabilidad de compartir información con el maestro tocante a los intereses y las habilidades del niño/a.)

- The responsibility to attend parent conferences and to communicate regularly with the school concerning their child's academic progress.

(La responsabilidad de asistir a conferencias de padres y de comunicarse regularmente con la escuela acerca del progreso académico de sus niños.)

- The responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly, completes all homework and classroom assignments, and adheres to the District's Educational Accord, Honor Code, and school behavior policies.

DISTRICTWIDE SURVEY RESULTS

Last year's survey results

- ❖ 94% of students reported that the school encourages an appreciation of student diversity and respect for each other.
- ❖ 90% of students reported they feel the school is safe.
- ❖ 74% of students reported that the school does a good job to prevent bullying.

PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY

(la Póliza de Participación de Padres de la escuela)

A. Administration and staff will:

- Provide assistance to parents, as appropriate, in understanding such topics as the Nevada Academic Content Standards and the school performance framework, state and local assessments, the requirements of Title I, how to monitor their student's academic progress and how to work with school staff to improve the achievement of the student. The school's website has all of this information for parents. This information was reviewed at our annual Title I parent meeting. Parents can access students' progress reports/grades via Infinite Campus. Teachers also provide weekly/monthly communication that assist parents in learning what their students are learning and how to help them at home.
- The staff at Marion Earl will utilize the components of an effective lesson, and the technology available to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment enabling students to meet the state academic standards. Teachers use diagnostic/formative/summative assessments to create a customized curriculum to meet the needs of their students. Assessments include: Brigance, MAP, DRA, SBAC, MAP Fluency, and EasyCBM. Teachers use materials from the literacy lab and collaborate with each other to create these lessons.
- Offer parent involvement activities in the school that will include opportunities for parents to volunteer and be involved in school activities:
 - Annual Title I meeting
 - Registering students at the school site- even offered in Spanish
 - Monthly SOT Meetings
 - Fall Festival
 - Reading Under the Stars- an activity where parents can read with their students
 - Scholastic Book Fair, Math/Literacy Night – as possible

B. The school will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve the student's achievement, such as literacy training and using technology as appropriate, to foster parental involvement. The materials may be sent home via paper distribution and will be placed on our school's website. The FACES and ELL teams will conduct bi-monthly meetings/PD to address a variety of parent/academic issues: such as attendance, parenting, and helping students at home. Parents are referred to the Diskin ES parent center for other needs.

C. With regard to professional development the administration will collaborate with parents, teachers, pupil service personnel, and staff on professional development. Parents and other personnel will be encouraged to voice their opinions, which will then drive the need for particular staff training. Parents can offer suggestions during Title I meetings, SOT meetings, and via email/phone to administration. Professional development will include, but is not limited to:

- o Curriculum and Instruction as it relates to the Nevada Academic Content Standards (NEPF)
- o Create a Parent Book Study focusing on the impact parent engagement has on student achievement
- o The Response to Intervention Process

D. The staff at Marion Earl will ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings and other activities (newsletters, notes, and website information) is sent to parents in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.
